






February is Oral Health Month! are some helpful tips to assist in maintaining your child's optimal dental health and hygiene.

Oral Health:

- Have your child visit the dentist on a regular basis. Usually, most regular check-ups should be every six months. It is generally recommended that your child begin regular dental check-ups at the age of three.
- Keep your child's mouth clean by having them brush their teeth at least twice a day, and floss daily. Flossing helps to remove food and plague that becomes lodged between your teeth and gums. It is always a good idea to have your child also brush Hearing and Vision: their teeth after sweet and sticky foods. Brushing and flossing teeth regularly helps and continue through March 29th. fight tooth decay and gum disease.
- When selecting a toothbrush for your tled brush. It is recommended that toothbrushes be replaced every three-four months or sooner if it shows signs of wear. Also, do not forget to change toothbrushes if your child is diagnosed with Strep!
- Eating healthy, unprocessed foods promotes good oral health. Try to reduce sugar intake. Sugar is a major cause of dental problems. Remind them to brush their teeth after consuming sugary treats and food.
- At six years of age, a fluoride rinse may help prevent cavities. Ask your dentist which product is best to meet the needs of your child.
- Ask your dentist about dental sealants. These are thin plastic protective barriers that fill in the chewing surfaces of the 410-357-8369 back teeth protecting them from tooth decay.

With these few simple steps, we can promote good oral health for our children and allow them to have healthy, beautiful smiles!!

> If your child is in need of further evaluation by a physician, a letter will be sent home by the Health Department, once all testing for the school has been completed.

Seventh District Elementary School Kindergarten Round-Up

Seventh District's annual kindergarten registration is scheduled for April 6th and April 7th. Students are eligible to be registered for kindergarten for the 2017-2018 school year if they turn five (5) years old on or prior to September 1, 2017. If you plan for your child to attend kindergarten at Seventh District Elementary School please call the school

Seventh District Kindergarten Pre-Registration Form 2017-2018

Students are eligible to be registered for kindergarten for the school year 2017-2018 if they turn five (5) years old on or prior to September 1, 2017. This follows the Maryland State Department of Education age requirements for enrollment to kindergarten.

In order to be considered for early admission to kindergarten for the school year 2017-2018, the child must turn five (5) between September 2 and October 14, 2017.

- Early admission requests for the next year must be submitted to the home school principal between January 15 and June 1, 2017.
- Under certain conditions, a parent who moves into Baltimore County after the June 1, 2017, deadline
 may request early admission to kindergarten. In order for a request to be considered, the request must be
 made no later than the first day of school for the 2017-2018 school year.





The Four Way Test Of what we think, say and do...

Is it the truth? Is it fair to all concerned? Will it build goodwill and better friendships? Will it be beneficial to all concerned?

Dear 7th District Elementary School students and their families,

The Rotary Club of Hunt Valley is excited for the 2016-2017 Four-Way Test Contest.

This year, our School will feature an ethics program that has been described by its creator as "24 words that will change your life." That quote describes the Four-Way Test, which is the code of ethics for Rotary Clubs around the world and the one right here in the Hunt Valley area.

You may have already seen a Four-Way Test bookmark or poster in the school this year, but the fun part of the program begins this month. We are asking 3rd-through 5th-grade students to create a poster that addresses all four elements of the Four-Way Test, which are:

Is it the truth? Is it fair to all concerned? Will it build goodwill and better friendships? Will it be beneficial to all concerned?

You will need a half of a piece of poster board paper - 22" x 14". This can be purchased at the Dollar Store, Target, Staples, etc. There will be a first, second and third place winner in each grade, and prize money (\$40 for first, \$30 for second and \$20 for third) will be awarded.

This is a poster contest for elementary school students, and it is up to your child to complete the poster independently. You can discuss ideas with your child and get him or her off to a good start. You may be asking yourself, "Does my child need to be an artist to enter?" The answer is most certainly, "No."

Students can cut and paste magazine pictures, computer generated pictures and words, pictures from coloring books, newspapers, wallpaper, foam cut-outs or recycled art projects, as long as they communicate the core values of the Four-Way Test. Students can use markers, crayons, colored pencils, paint, glitter or any other conventional or unconventional art supply. Please use poster paper

The Rotary Club of Hunt Valley will judge the entries based on the following criteria:

- All four questions must appear on the poster.
- How the four questions of the Four-Way Test are addressed.
- A slogan or title must be used to tie the concept together.
- Quality designs that include neat, bright and colorful illustrations must fill the poster.

Students must return their entry to the school counseling office by Monday, March 6, 2017. It is important that all entries include the student's name, grade and teacher's name. A member of the Hunt Valley Rotary Club will then pick up the entries and determine the winners from each grade. Those winners will be announced in March and letters will go home to parents.
